## *Conservation Corps Wins Grant to Establish a Demonstration Garden*

**C**ongratulations to the Kingston Chase Conservation Corps on the award of a grant earned in response to its proposal to the Fairfax County Neighborhood Enhancement Partnership Program. The proposal to create a community Demonstration Garden of native plants, including rain barrels and a butterfly garden, was selected out of 45 applications as one of the top ranked proposals and was awarded funding in the amount of \$1,900.

“Now comes the hard part,” said Jane Hampson, Conservation Corps Chairperson, upon learning of the exciting news. “This is because the proposal requires Kingston Chase to match the grant funds with like contributions.” Matching contributions can be in the form of volunteer hours, plant donations, reduced rates for services (such as the company of homeowner Matt Kucik doing prep work on the plot), holding fundraisers (such

as raffles and a car wash), getting neighbors to adopt a plant, and actual cash donations.

The Conservation Corps looks forward to working with volunteers in the neighborhood as well as club members to turn this vision into a living, thriving reality for the benefit of everyone. The letter announcing the award is included on page 6.

As mentioned above, because conditions of the Demonstration Garden grant require that our community match the awarded funds, the Conservation Corps will begin securing three types of matching funds, in addition to volunteer hours: cash donations by homeowners and businesses, donated funds from the HOA, and sponsorship or donations of specific plants.

## *Annual Spring Cleanup of the Folly Lick Branch Park Set for April 9*

**I**t is almost spring, and that means it is almost time for the annual spring cleanup of the Folly Lick Branch Park, the woods and stream adjacent to Kingston Chase and following Hiddenbrook Drive to Dranesville Road. Please mark your calendar for this highly productive event! It will be held on Saturday, April 9, beginning at 9:00 a.m. and finishing up around 12:00 noon.

The Alice Ferguson Foundation is once again sponsoring the event and will be providing trash bags for recycling materials and regular trash. Again this year there will be two assembly points: (1) one at the park entrance on Milliken's Bend and (2) at the clubhouse by the pool, especially for Kingston Chase volunteers. With the addition of the paved path from the pond to the previous paths in the park, there is much greater access to the stream which will make it easier to get the trash out.

The project is part of the Annual Potomac River Watershed Cleanup, now in its 23rd year, which last year took place at over 500 sites in DC, Maryland, Virginia, Pennsylvania and West Virginia—all part of the lands, or watershed, that drain into the Potomac River. There were 76 sites in Fairfax County alone. Fields, forests, parking lots and other ‘inlands’ are targeted in an effort to remove trash before it enters creeks and other waterways.

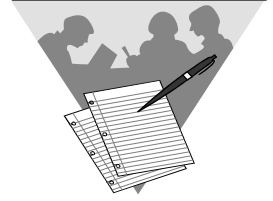

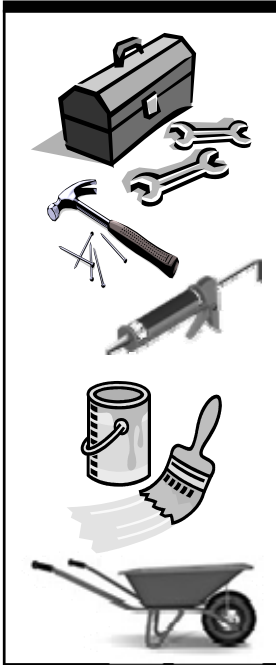

### **Conservation Corps Wins Grant to Establish a Demonstration Garden**

The Conservation Corps would love to acquire plants that are already acclimated to the micro-ecosystem that is Kingston Chase. For those plants that must be bought from a nursery, we welcome sponsorship of a plant or donations of any amount. If you are able to donate some of the following plants from your own yard or garden, that would be ideal. The club is hoping to acquire:

- 12 square feet of Anise requires 12 plants @ \$2.50 each = \$30
- 14 square feet of Aster requires 9 plants at 6 for \$28.99 + 3 for \$15.99 = \$28.99 + \$15.99 = \$44.98
- 50 square feet of Liriope requires 24 plants @ 3 for \$9.99 = 8 X 9.99 = \$79.92
- 25 square feet of Butterfly Weed requires 9 plants @ 3 for \$19.99 = >> 3 X \$19.99 = \$59.97
- 7 square feet of New Jersey Tea requires 4 plants @ \$6 each = \$24
- 18 square feet of Joe-Pye Weed requires 3 plants @ \$7.50 each = \$22.50
- 7 square feet of Wild Bergamot (Bee Balm) requires 3 plants @ \$4 = \$12
- 6 square feet of Fennel requires 1 packet of seeds directly sown @ \$2.95 = \$2.95
- 10 square feet of parsley requires 1 packet of seeds directly sown @ \$3.95 = \$3.95
- 22 square feet of Clover requires 1 packet of seeds directly sown @ \$3.49 = \$3.49
- 21 square feet of White Snake Root requires 12 plants @ \$3.00 each = \$36.00
- 4 square feet of French Marigold requires 1 packet of seeds directly sown @ \$4.95 = \$4.95
