

Rules and Regulations for the Kingston Chase Swimming Pool

1. Drive slowly in the parking lot.
2. All bikes must be parked in the designated area (on or around the bike rack).
3. No overnight parking is permitted.
4. No person is allowed in the pool unless a lifeguard is on duty.
5. No loud, abusive, or profane language or breach of good behavior will be tolerated.
6. No intoxicated persons shall be allowed in the pool area.
7. Smoking is not permitted within the pool fenced area or bath house. Any smoking must take place outside the pool gates. Sand filled containers are available outside the pool entrance for extinguishing smoking materials.
8. Eating and drinking is allowed within the designated area only.
9. No pets allowed, except after the pool is closed for the season and Kingston Chase holds its annual "Dog Day at the Pool."
10. Street clothing may not be used for swimming.
11. Rubber soled shoes only will be allowed on the pool deck.
12. All swimmers must take a shower before entering the pool.
13. Any damage to pool equipment or the premises will be paid for by the member responsible. If the damage is determined to be deliberate by the Board of Directors, the Pool Committee/Board can suspend the member's use of the pool. (Remember that property owners are members, their children, guests, or tenants are their responsibility.)
14. Any person having infectious diseases, sores, or inflamed eyes, colds, nasal discharges, or any other communicable disease of any kind will not be permitted inside the pool area.
15. Children who are not yet toilet trained are required to wear **DIAPERS WITH TIGHT RUBBER PANTS**.
16. Children 5 years and under are permitted in the main pool during break if accompanied by an adult.
17. Children 5 and under **ONLY** are allowed in the baby pool when accompanied by a parent or guardian (14 years and older) at all times.
18. Any misuse of the shower area, including loitering, will result in expulsion from the pool. The length of suspension will be determined by the General Manager, not to exceed 5 consecutive days.
19. When the pool is closed for any reason, staff members are the only people allowed to stay in the pool area.
20. No flotation device over 26" in diameter will be allowed except on Thursdays from 1:00 p.m. until closing. If the manager on duty feels that the pool is becoming unsafe because of too many floats, they may at that time require everyone to take them out of the water.
21. Games will be allowed in the diving area at the discretion of the manager on duty.
22. There will be a 15-minute break at the end of every hour during which everyone under the age of 16 will be required to sit out of the water. (Except as stated in Rule #16)
23. Inappropriate use of any pool toys will cause them to be confiscated by the lifeguard or manager. Squirt guns (**NOT WATER CANNONS**) will be allowed in the pool.
24. KCHOA children who have had their 9th birthday may come to the pool without adult supervision **PROVIDED THEY PASS A BASIC SWIM TEST**. (The test consists of swimming 25 meters free style [1 length of the pool] and treading water for 1 minute.)
25. The lifeguards on duty, with the support of the pool manager, have the authority to set rules and regulations on-site and as necessary for the fun and safety of all.

Any violation of the above rules, as determined by the pool manager, can result in the suspension of pool privileges for any member of their family and guest by the pool manager on duty, not to exceed 5 consecutive days. Any subsequent violation by a member will result in immediate suspension of pool use until the Pool Committee/Board of Directors reviews the situation and makes a decision.
